

Project overview

Australian property development company, Walker Corporation, is partnering with Redland City Council and the Queensland Government to revitalise the Toondah Harbour Priority Development Area.

The site is based on the existing marine facility at Cleveland, approximately 30 kilometres from Brisbane CBD

Walker's \$1.4 billion investment in the environmental, cultural and economic future of the Redlands will be a game-changer for the City and South East Queensland. It will create an exciting new mainland destination showcasing the natural attractions of Moreton Bay and Islands and provide a world class gateway to the Bay and North Stradbroke Island for locals and visitors alike.

Key features of the design include;

- · New state of the art port facility
- Capacity for charter and additional operators, which will facilitate investment in exciting new nature and culturebased eco-tourism experiences for the Quandamooka Coast
- A 3.5 hectare foreshore parklands with South Bank-style lagoon pool and water play area
- A 3.5 hectare conservation park with wetland education and cultural centre, bird hides and low impact walking trails
- Unprecedented foreshore access including 1.5 kilometres of boardwalks, nature and heritage trails
- A range of new recreational boating facilities including ~200 berth recreational marina, public pontoon and sheltered boat ramp with trailer parking
- Marina plaza with boutique retail and dining precinct that will become a premier leisure and events destination
- Hotel and convention facilities that will provide corporate and leisure accommodation, meeting and function facilities
- 3,600 dwellings that will provide housing choice and ensure a vibrant and financially sustainable destination
- 1,010 dedicated public car parking spaces for ferry users, with Council plans for a further 500 in a multi-deck structure if required.



Project timeline

The project is currently in the environmental referral phase, with the environment assessment process to commence in Quarter 3 2018 and expected to take approximately 18 months.
